



## Code of Conduct

We believe that all students should feel safe and enjoy a positive learning and social environment. To ensure this experience, MITY students are expected to adhere to the highest standards of good citizenship, honesty, and integrity in their academic work and in their personal conduct. MITY's Code of Conduct outlines expectations and rules for all students in the MITY community. ***Please read the following statements. You will be asked to sign the Health Form stating that you agree to follow this Code during your time at MITY.***

- MITY students are expected to show courtesy and respect for their fellow students, for MITY staff members and for Macalester College / the host school's personnel. MITY students are expected to follow the instructions of the MITY staff and college / school personnel.
  - MITY students shall not take part in or facilitate discrimination of any kind, including, but not limited to, discrimination based on race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, national origin, or disability.
  - MITY students are expected to show respect for and take reasonable care of the property, including their classrooms, dorms, dining areas, and other facilities, equipment and furnishings.
  - MITY students are expected to respect the belongings of others. They shall not borrow, use, or disturb items belonging to other students, MITY staff, or school staff without clear prior permission.
  - MITY students shall not use, possess, or distribute alcohol, tobacco, or drugs at any time during the session. This includes any off-campus activities. Students who violate this rule will be sent home immediately. Prescription and over-the-counter medications should only be used under the supervision of the MITY staff. Parents/guardians should notify the MITY office if it is necessary for a student to carry medication with them.
  - MITY students shall not commit acts of violence on persons or property, nor shall they threaten to commit any act of violence either verbally, in writing, or electronically.
  - MITY students shall not engage in any form of sexual harassment. Sexual harassment includes sexual conduct, or conduct with sexual overtones, which has the purpose or effect of creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive learning or social environment.
  - MITY students are expected to know and to follow all rules presented by the staff during the program for all activities both on and off campus.
  - MITY staff reserves the right to determine if disciplinary action is necessary for not obeying the rules outlined above.
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### ***Additional Expectations for Residential Students:***

- MITY students are expected to attend all classes, meals and planned evening and weekend activities and to be on time for them. If you are ill, contact your dorm supervisor or the MITY office. Students cannot enter the dormitory between 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 pm Monday - Friday.
- MITY students are to be in the dormitory by 9:45 p.m., in their rooms by 10:30 p.m., and lights out and cell phones turned off at 11:00 p.m. Exceptions may be made when students are attending an evening event. Dorm supervisors will do room checks each night. Remember: Breakfast is at 8:00 am and classes begin at 9:00 am.
- Dormitory rooms are double occupancy. When other residential students are in the room visiting, the room doors must remain open so the room can function more as a living room than a bedroom. Only residential students and supervisors are allowed in the residence hall.
- Residential students are expected to stay on campus during their two weeks at MITY. Visits to family and friends should occur before or after the session.
- A "zone map" will be given to students at the orientation meeting. It shows the area around Macalester where students may walk after signing out with a dorm supervisor. Students are not to leave this zone. Remember that all behaviors stated in the Code of Conduct apply whether on or off campus during the session.
- Roommates are assigned based on the roommate survey filled out by students. Changes to these assignments will rarely be made, and will be evaluated on an individual basis.
- On the last day, check out for residential students is between 2:30 pm - 3:30 pm. Dorm supervisors will check the rooms and sign out students during this time. Students are expected to remain on campus for all activities on the last day.
